


- Positive, negative, primary and secondary longterm impacts or changes, resulting directly or indirectly, intended or not intended from the development intervention
- Tangible short or medium term outcomes resulting from any development intervention, and as a result of the achieved outputs
- Outputs are the outcomes produced as a results of inputs, actions and activities
- Actions and activities produced using the allocated resources
- The necessary financial, human, material and logistical resources used in the project or development intervention

Objective of the logical framework process

To show the following:

- 1. The development intervention relationship in a broad context
- 2. Clarification of assumptions regarding the causal relationship between the objectives of the development initiative at all levels
- 3. Show how all components of the development initiative work together to achieve results and impact
- 4. Develop a mechanism that accurately defines how performance indicators are calculated
- 5. Lead the impact investigation process

It is thus derived and based on the logical framework, and is not an independent process that exists separately

Objective of the Logical Framework Approach

To show the hierarchical and causal relationship between:

- 1. الأثر (Impact)
- 2. النتائج (Outcome)
- 3. المخرجات (Output)
- 4. النشاطات (Activities)
- 5. المدخلات (Input)

In addition to the assumptions and risks that could affect the success or failure of the development intervention

Monitoring and Evaluation Framework provides ...

- List of indicators approved in the project's logical framework.
- The definition of each indicator and the method for its calculation determines the "Performance Indicators Reference Sheet"
- Identify and answers the following questions: "who", "what", "when", "how"
- Determines who is responsible for data collection
- Identify sources of data collection and its collection method
- Specify when and the frequency of updating the indicators and their data

The two intersect through:

- Providing a logical analysis in an integrated manner to the relevant scheme of how resources are managed. Together, they enhance the efficiency of resource use, increase the effectiveness of development interventions, and enhance impact
- Clarifying the assumptions that are formulated in a clear descriptive and scientific manner in order to determine and plot the causal relationship between resources and activities on one hand, and the results & impact on the other, by providing purely scientific and logical explanations

Why the Monitoring and Evaluation Framework?

- It is a planning tool at the operational level rather than strategic one as a logical framework approach
- It is a tool that outlines the objectives of the development intervention in detail, showing the causal relationship through the monitoring and evaluation plan
- It is a regulatory framework for the relationship of resources and activities
- It is a detailed guide to the performance indicators
- It is a detailed management tool that shows the frequency and regularity of the monitoring of interventions, activities and data collection to form a database that will then allow carrying out the evaluation process
- To date the development of performance indicators data
- Determine the responsibility of data collection and analysis in the monitoring and evaluation process



Results Framework is...


A chart used to illustrate a development policy adopted to achieve a specific development objective over a specified period of time. This framework reflects the logic of cause and outcome. The Results Framework is a tool for planning, management, communication.





RESULTS FRAMEWORK


- **a. Strategic Goal:** The highest level of impact that the organization would like to achieve within a specific timetable within its strategic plan.
- **b.** The Ultimate Goal is the "Development Objective": the most ambitious goal or outcome that the Organization seeks to achieve and can be accountable for, along with its partners, over a certain time period. A strategic plan can include more than one ultimate goal.
- c. Intermediate Result: The measurable variables, which individually and collectively help to achieve the ultimate goal, if the important assumptions listed have proven to be true.
- d. The immediate Goal is the "Sub-Intermediate Result": Changes that contribute to the achievement of the intermediate objective, if the significant assumptions listed have proven to be true.


