What is a Grant?

Grants are financial **assistance** providing support or stimulation to accomplish a public (project) purpose, consistent with grantee's mandate

Distinguishing Features:

- ✓ Governed by specific set of regulations
- ✓ Relationship is one of sponsorship
- ✓ Often entails capacity building



What is a Subcontract?

Subcontracts are **acquisitions** to purchase goods or services on behalf of the U.S. government

Distinguishing Features:

- ✓ Relationship is one of buyer and seller
- ✓ Acquisition of goods and services for prime contract implementation
- ✓ Requires oversight and technical direction



Grant vs. Acquisition

With a grant, USAID sponsors a recipient program.

With acquisition, USAID owns the program or activity.



Grant or Subcontract

 Funding a local farmer's organization to engage and encourage regional farmers to use organic fertilizers and high value seedlings to enhance crop production and increase sales at the market.
 Grant

Funding a firm to supply and deliver the seeds, organic fertilizer and shovels to the farmers.

Subcontract

Funding a firm to provide on-going training to an NGO on financial management.

Subcontract

 Funding a microfinance organization to strengthen their capacity to ensure high quality lending practices and products are being offered to the marketplace, therefore generating more confidence and acceptance by local borrowers

Four

What are they? Simplified

Fixed Amount Award

Standard

In-Kind

Types of Grants

Simplified

- Max of simplified acquisition threshold per grant, no limit on duration
- Reimbursement basis
- No indirect costs
- Equipment only if necessary

USAID FROM THE AMERICAN PEOPLE

Fixed Amount

- Per Chem guidance, max \$500,000/year, \$1.5m total
- Normally shorter duration but can be up to 3 years
- Fixed tranche payments upon achievement of milestones
- Accomplishments clear and discernible
- Low risk and management burden; Requires more up-front work

Standard

- No max amount or duration
- Advances or reimbursement
- May include int'l travel, indirect costs
- Increased grantee financial and reporting requirements...high risk for project

In-Kind

- No max amount or duration
- Can be portion of any grant type, or 100% inkind grant
- Not an official grant type
- Pre-award risk assessment requires, but less extensive



Payment Methods

Simplified

Periodic reimbursements based on submission of receipt Fixed Amount

Fixed amount tranche payments based on achievement of milestones (no receipts) Standard

Periodic advances and/or reimbursements (receipts) In-Kind

Direct payment to vendor

Grant Agreement - Terms and Conditions



ADS 303 - Grants and Cooperative Agreements to Non-Governmental Organizations

- Provides comprehensive guide for grants programs
- Includes Mandatory and Required as Applicable Standard Provisions (2 sets one for FAAs and a second for other types)



Examples of Mandatory and Required As Applicable Standard Provisions

- Allowable Costs
- Accounting, Audit, and Records
- Amendment of Award and Revision of Budget
- Advance Payment and Refunds
- Reimbursement Payment and Refunds
- Subawards
- Procurement Policies
- USAID Eligibility Rules for Procurement of Commodities and Services
- Trafficking in Persons



Clauses To Be Reviewed Before Signing Awards

- Financials and Budget
- Period of Award
- Purpose of Award/Program Description and Deliverables
- Authorized Geographic Code
- Mandatory and Required as Applicable Standard Provisions

- Special Provisions (Audits, Environmental Compliance)
- Special Award Conditions (as applicable)
- Reporting Requirement
- Certification



Financials and Budget

- Total Value Cannot go above this amount for the life of the activity
- Obligated/Incrementally Funded a smaller partial amount of the total value that you cannot exceed
- Set up a system to track your expenditures against both your obligation and the total value of your agreement



Period of Award

- You cannot incur expenses outside of the period of performance listed in your agreement
- Not a problem yet but it is important to keep this in mind will you need more time?



Certifications

ADS 303.3.8 mandates certain certifications that the grantee must sign prior to grant award.

Examples of Certifications:

- ✓ Representation by Organization Regarding A Delinquent Tax Liability or a Felony Criminal Conviction
- ✓ Certification Regarding Lobbying
- ✓ Certification Regarding Terrorist Financing
- ✓ Certification of Recipient



Temporary Custodianship Agreement (TCA)

- By signing the TCA, Custodian agrees to:
- ✓ Use the Property solely for project implementation activities;
- ✓ Maintain and return the Property to Chemonics in good operating condition;
- ✓ Be responsible for all repairs to the Property during its custodianship;
- ✓ Safeguard the Property and ensure all items are securely stored when not in use;
- ✓ Refrain from modifying the equipment in any manner;

- ✓ Maintain insurance on the Property during the term of this agreement;
- ✓ Be responsible for all loss or damage to the Property until its return to Chemonics;
- ✓ Replace any item if it is lost, stolen, or damaged due to negligence;
- ✓ Notify Chemonics of any problem with the items at the time it occurs;
- ✓ Immediately notify Chemonics if the equipment becomes lost, stolen, or damaged.
